The primary care specialties are important ones in today's Primary Care-centered healthcare environment. The breadth of responsibility for patient care in Internal Medicine and Primary Care in general calls for a broad scope of topics. These Educational activity responds to these challenging needs and offers important and timely reviews and updates in various areas of Medicine Therefore, physicians and practitioners from most specialties will benefit from the information provided in this review and update in Family & Internal Medicine. We expect that at this meeting we would achieve level 5 of Moore's criteria.
